Older Adult Medicine (OAM) in Transition to Residency (TTR)

2023-2024 Pilot

In 2023-2024, a small-scale optional Older Adult Medicine (OAM) Pilot is being conducted during the 3 blocks of TTR, offered to students as a selective, to evaluate feasibility and ensure and improve upon the design of the clinical experience prior to implementation of the full-scale mandatory clinical experience planned for 2024-2025.

- When: During Transition to Residency (TTR): January-April of 4th year
- How long: 3 clinical blocks of 3, 3, and 2 weeks each
 - Block A: Feb 12, 2024 March 3, 2024
 - o Block B: March 4, 2024 March 24, 2024
 - o Block C: March 25, 2024 April 7, 2024

Evaluation of OAM Pilot: Students will be evaluated using the current TTR learning evaluation forms

- Student evaluation on MEDSIS (TTR evaluation form)
 - <u>Clinical evaluations</u> primary preceptor with input from others who supervised the learner
 - Professionalism evaluation
